

A WARNING TO ALL LITIGANTS USING THESE FORMS!

Chapter 61 of the Florida Statutes primarily governs family court proceedings, **and the statute has been amended** effective October 1, 2008.

The Sixth Judicial Circuit provides the attached parenting plan forms to comply with the amendments of Chapter 61. The Supreme Court has not approved these revised forms. The forms are being used temporarily for your convenience until the Supreme Court approves a parenting plan form or forms to comply with the statute's amendments. (Most forms were originally created by the Twelfth Judicial Circuit and have been modified for use in the Sixth Judicial Circuit.)

Use these forms at your own risk. Changes in the law or court rules affect the accuracy of these forms or the forms' instructions. In no event will the Sixth Judicial Circuit, or anyone who has contributed to the revision of these forms or instructions, be liable for any direct, indirect, or consequential damages resulting from their use. **THE CLERK CAN NOT GUARANTEE THESE LOCAL DOCUMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED BY ALL JUDGES IF THEY DIFFER FROM THE ONES ULTIMATELY ADOPTED BY THE SUPREME COURT.**
